Detailed description of the internship project(s); tasks assigned	<p>Sustainable development and greener economies are among the main goals supported by the work of the United Nations. To achieve these goals, the bio-based industry is gaining more importance and is developing quickly. The forest industry contributes in many ways to this development by providing renewable resources such as timber, wood fibres, energy, food, etc.</p> <p>As one of its tasks, the UNECE/FAO Forestry and Timber Section is currently conducting, in close cooperation with its member States, the Forest Sector Outlook Study. The study will analyze possible future scenarios for the forest sector for the coming 20 - 30 year. The Carlo Schmid fellow can make a significant contribution to this work.
